the glattfelder etc families originally of switzerland casper glattfelder 1709 1774 75 and his brother johannes peter glattfelder 1700 1742 were sons of felix glattfelder and barbara gorius both born in glattfelden eglisau zurich switzwerland casper married 1 elizabeth lauffer 1711 1743 46 in 1731 in switzerland and 2 anna maria d 1775 about 1745 in pennsylvania he died in codorus twp york co pa johannes peter glattfelder married salomea amberg b 1704 1721 in glattfelden hons heinrich glattfelder 1671 1734 was also born in glattfelden where he married dorothea gorius d 1719 in 1693 descendants live in york co pa davidson co n c tennessee ohio indiana illinois kansas missouri california switzerland and elsewhere

john bennett married elizabeth in about 1681 they had five children all of whom were born in north farnham parish richmond county virginia descendants and relatives lived mainly in virginia georgia north carolina louisiana and texas

george hobson sr ca 1677 1748 was born in england and died in frederick co virginia he was an apple farmer george and his wife elizabeth supposedly arrived in philadelphia in 1697 from england they had not been definitely located until 1732 when they are found in orange co va what is now berkeley co west virginia prior to orange county they most likely lived in chester co pennsylvania they had one son george hobson jr ca 1716 1797 born in chester co pa and died in chatham co north carolina he married 1 hannah elizabeth kinnison ca 1717 1761 daughter of edward kinnison and mary greenaway in 1732 in burlington co n j he married 2 rebekah ca 1761 fourteen children are recorded in this book he supposedly had twenty descendants live in north carolina missouri oklahoma oregon arkansas indiana pennsylvania texas utah kansas california north dakota utah arizona and elsewhere

john evans was born 11 january 1798 in fayetteville north carolina his parents were josiah evans and rebecca locke he married frances augusta jane knight 1811 1884 daughter of james knight and elizabeth 24 june 1828 in waynesboro georgia they had

eleven children descendants and relatives lived mainly in georgia alabama florida tennessee ohio and texas
