dialectical behavior therapy dbt is a specific type of cognitive behavioral psychotherapy developed in the late 1980s by psychologist marsha m linehan to help better treat borderline personality disorder since its development it has also been used for the treatment of other kinds of mental health disorders the oxford handbook of dbt charts the development of dbt from its early inception to the current cutting edge state of knowledge about both the theoretical underpinnings of the treatment and its clinical application across a range of disorders and adaptations to new clinical groups experts in the treatment address the current state of the evidence with respect to the efficacy of the treatment its effectiveness in routine clinical practice and central issues in the clinical and programmatic implementation of the treatment in sum this volume provides a desk reference for clinicians and academics keen to understand the origins and current state of the science and the art of dbt

møller sheds light on the inner aspects of psychosis and psychosis risk and its core experiential phenomena as a method of understanding the individual early psychosis development the book details how such experiences might take shape in the human mind and how a better understanding achieved through detailed clinical conversations can lead to earlier detection and improved interventions møller also outlines the subjectivity model also called ipseity disturbance model and presents a broad review of different treatment approaches and settings in which work with disturbed self experience could be integrated including psychotherapy in patient milieu therapy supportive treatments psychoeducational family work local networking and medication psychosis risk and experience of the self will prove essential for experienced and specialised clinicians as well as the more generally interested reader

hartvig dahl this is a book about the future that we hope will arouse the curiosity of clinicians and point a direction for researchers it marks the surprisingly rapid evolution of psychodynamic psychotherapy research from an applied toward a basic science and as its title implies describes strategies to follow rather than results to live by it was not always thus a quarter of a century ago the editors of two volumes of psychotherapy research reports summarized the state of the field then although there has been a great accumulation of clinical observations and experimental findings the field has made relatively little progress there has been little creative building on the work of others parloff and rubinstein 1962 psychological research generally has tended to be insufficiently additive research people often find it hard to keep informed of related work done on the same site and elsewhere and therefore do not build upon each other's foundation luborsky and strupp 1962

in his earlier book rational emotive therapy fundamentals and innovations dr dryden outlined the central features of rational emotive therapy as it had developed in and from the work of albert ellis he then proceeded to discuss innovations within the theory several of which had been instigated by the author originally published in 1987 this book builds upon these latter elements it discusses the theoretical basis of ret arguing that it can be accurately described as theoretically consistent eclectic therapy and analyses the problems encountered in and the benefits derived from its practice at the time this book provided a state of the art discussion of ret and will still be of interest for those involved in counselling psychotherapy clinical psychology psychiatry and social work

those in the counseling profession are interacting more with people from other cultures the u s sphere of influence throughout the world is spreading increasingly we are providing services to clients who are not caucasian or of european heritage and our educational programs have been active in training both domestic students of diverse ethnic backgrounds as well as foreign students these factors combine to contribute to the need for those who provide counseling to understand the elements involved in interacting with a wide spectrum of people this book meets that need by providing a brief synopsis on such topics as common factors values universals cross cultural competence and models approaches and psychological perspectives of human behavior theories of personality the emphasis is on material that relies more on the use of the scientific method and data instead of anecdotal and experiential literature for the reader who is interested in obtaining information from which statements are derived there are references to investigate the material further unlike other book that stress the barriers between counselor and client this book adds the perspective that there are factors that facilitate interactions between the two there are also frequent cross cultural examples in the book to facilitate awareness of similarities and differences in views of human behavior samples of african arab chinese and european american perspectives are represented there is also a relatively large section on applications this consists of such subjects as cross cultural aspects of psychological theories ethics research tests euro american approaches and experiences client characteristics client and counselor interactions and therapeutic techniques many other topics are covered as well students and professionals in the fields of counseling and psychology will find this book to be an invaluable addition to their library

the book discusses compensation mechanisms and other non judicial means that offer alternatives to court proceedings designed and provided for within national legal regimes such schemes are primarily of a civil or administrative character and are mainly intended to supplement criminal liability for medical negligence as such the book focuses on medical malpractice and prospective medical harm from a civil law perspective it examines the contemporary perspective of a patient physician relationship which has evolved from a relation of a quasi patrimonial character into a partnership of quasi equal parties dealing with a medical treatment procedure as a scientific endeavor it also reviews the extra legal conditions that are taken into account in compensation arrangements particularly the need to satisfy a psychological urge for conciliation and empathy on the part of medical personnel lastly the book explores the responsibility of public authorities and healthcare providers to guarantee access to healthcare that is of a sufficient quality based upon standards provided for in international and european law

developmental and clinical issues in the treatment of children is the first volume to address the needs of practicing clinicians and other professionals who work in applied mental health settings it represents the first interface of clinical child psychology developmental psychopathology specific child disorders and contextual issues this text s primary purpose is to bring these areas together to build upon the current knowledge base about children child problems and child treatment in summary this compendium integrates the major clinical and developmental issues involved in the real treatment of children the contents of each chapter are relevant to the needs and concerns of practitioners while based on findings from the empirical literature

betty cannon is the first to explore the implications of sartrean philosophy for the freudian psychoanalytic tradition drawing upon sartre s work as well as her own experiences as a practicing therapist she shows that sartre was a fellow traveler who appreciated freud s psychoanalytic achievements but rebelled against the determinism of his metatheory the mind sartre argued cannot be reduced to a collection of drives and structures nor is it enslaved to its past as freud s work suggested sartre advocated an existentialist psychoanalysis based on human freedom and the self s ability to reshape its own meaning and value through the sartrean approach cannon offers a resolution to the crisis in psychoanalytic metatheory created by the current emphasis on relational needs by comparing sartre with freud and influential post freudians like melanie klein otto kernber margaret mahler d w winnicott heinz kohut harry stack sullivan and jacques lacan she demonstrates why the sartrean model transcends the limitations of traditional freudian metatheory in the process she adds a new dimension to our understanding of sartre and his place in twentieth century philosophy

a companion to the editors highly successful earlier volume this second volume brings the coverage up to date with 18 chapters in four parts organized sectionally as theoretical approaches to the practice of play therapy developmental adaptations of play therapy play therapy techniques and methods and play therapy applications
