this book details the theatrical productions of writer zora neale hurston and their influence on american dance in the 1930s it describes hurston s revues and the bahamian dancers she worked with her efforts to produce a folk aesthetic in response to commercialized representations of black culture and how she worked with the dancers for the great day it also discusses power issues in producing the great day its representation of black folk culture reception and reproductions of its fire dance by white dancers

details the creation of a hebrew cultural aesthetic that was intentionally and distinctly physical from their conquest of palestine in 1917 during world war i until the establishment of the state of israel in 1948 the british controlled the territory by mandate representing a distinct cultural period in middle eastern history in embodying hebrew culture aesthetics athletics and dance in

the jewish community of mandate palestine author nina s spiegel argues that the jewish community of this era created enduring social political religious and cultural forms through public events such as festivals performances and celebrations she finds that the physical character of this national public culture represents one of the key innovations of zionism embedding the importance of the corporeal into national jewish life and remains a significant feature of contemporary israeli culture spiegel analyzes four significant events in this period that have either been unexplored or underexplored the beauty competitions for queen esther in conjunction with the purim carnivals in tel aviv from 1926 to 1929 the first maccabiah games or jewish olympics in tel aviv in 1932 the national dance competition for theatrical dance in tel aviv in 1937 and the dalia folk dance festivals at kibbutz dalia in 1944 and 1947 drawing on a vast assortment of archives throughout israel spiegel uses an array of untapped primary sources from written documents to visual and oral materials including films photographs posters and interviews methodologically spiegel offers an original approach integrating the fields of israel studies modern jewish history cultural history gender studies performance studies dance theory and history and sports studies in this detailed multi disciplinary volume spiegel demonstrates the ways that political and social issues can influence a new society and provides a dynamic framework for interpreting present day israeli culture students and teachers of israel studies performance studies and jewish cultural history will appreciate embodying hebrew culture

this volume looks at how various cultures use dance as a visual representation of their identity and how traditional dances change over time chiefly the work focuses on cultural representation and how it is sometimes manipulated

choreographing copyright is a new historical and cultural analysis of u s dance makers investment in intellectual property rights stretching from the late nineteenth century to the early twenty first the book reconstructs efforts to win copyright protection for choreography and teases out their raced and gendered politics showing how dancers have embraced intellectual property rights as a means to both consolidate and contest racial and gendered power a number of the artists featured in the book are well known in the history of american dance including loie fuller hanya holm and martha graham agnes de mille and george balanchine but the book also uncovers a host of marginalized figures from the south asian dancer mohammed ismail to

the african american pantomimist johnny hudgins to the african american blues singer alberta hunter to the white burlesque dancer faith dane who were equally interested in positioning themselves as subjects rather than objects of property drawing on critical race and feminist theories and on cultural studies of copyright choreographing copyright offers fresh insight into the raced and gendered hierarchies that govern the theatrical marketplace white women s historically contingent relationship to property rights legacies of ownership of black bodies and appropriation of non white labor and the tension between dance s ephemerality and its reproducibility

dance in palestine has a history as complex and contentious as the land itself whether dismissed as bacchantic madness by bible tourists in the 19th century revived and glorified by zionists pan arabists and palestinian nationalists in the 20th century or rejected by islamic reformists in the 21st century dance in palestine has a rich and elusive story that remains to be told raising dust traces one dancer s journey into palestine s past and present through historical archives the memories of dancers of yesteryear and into today s vibrant performing arts scene nicholas rowe shows how dance has acted as a barometer of social change a forum for debate and a means of expressing forbidden ideas far from apolitical this most physical of art forms has often defined the political mood of the day sumptuously illustrated the author provides a unique rare and compelling cultural history of dance in palestine

this book sets out to search for the second world the post socialist context in dance studies and examines the way it appears and reappears in today s globalized world it traces hidden and invisibilized legacies over the span of one century probing questions that can make viewers artists and scholars uncomfortable regarding dance histories memories circulations and production modes in and around the post socialist world the contributions delve into a variety of dance practices folk traditional ballet modern contemporary modes of dance production institutionalization processes festival making and market logics and dance circulations between centres and peripheries between different genres and styles the main focus is eastern europe including russia but the book also addresses cuba and china the book s historical examples

make the reader aware too of the post socialist bodies influence in today s dance including in contemporary dance scenes the post socialist context promises to be a prosperous laboratory to explore uncomfortable questions of legitimacy whose choreographic work is staged as a quality dance production which dance practices are worthy of scholarly study what are the limits of dance studies understanding of what dance is or should be in view of reclaiming the second world through dance this book thus probes questions that should be asked today but are not easy to answer questions that dance practitioners facilitators critics and researchers including ourselves are often not at ease with either in doing so the cracks of dance history begin to be sealed and neglected dance practices are written back into history provided with the academic recognition that they deserve

in contrast to the scholarly attention given to the research of dance and music in other south east asian countries such as thailand indonesia and the philippines malaysian performance traditions are rarely the focus of academic studies indeed this is the first book to have been published on zapin a malaysian performing art which extends to singapore and east sumatra the syncretic combination of arab and malay performance elements in this dance is explained in detail with the extensive use of dance notations and music transcriptions the book argues that the transposition of zapin from a communal level to a national one involved not only a change in the context in which the dance is performed but also a change in its structure and cultural meaning finally the book traces the historical evolution of the malay dance form from a participatory art to one that is passively observed and investigates the music and dance structure of the genre

as the ubiquitous jamaican musician bob marley once famously sang half the story has never been told this rings particularly true for the little known women in jamaican music who comprise significantly less than half of the caribbean nation s musical landscape this book covers the female contribution to jamaican music and its subgenres through dozens of interviews with vocalists instrumentalists bandleaders producers deejays and supporters of the arts relegated to marginalized spaces these pioneering women fought for their claim to the spotlight amid oppressive conditions to help create and shape jamaica s musical heritage

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
