with so much technical information about research methods it is easy to lose sight of the bigger picture of why we carry out educational research and where and how research might contribute to the improvement of education educational research an unorthodox introduction steps you through the wider social and political contexts of educational research focusing on fundamental questions such as what education actually is and what it is for in doing so the book raises questions that more orthodox introductions to the theory and practice of educational research often leave aside gert biesta covers a range of key issues which permeate any educational research project including the roles of theory in research what it means and takes to improve education the nature of educational practice the history of educational research and scholarship the connection between research professionalism and democracy and what the social and political dimensions of academic publishing are each chapter includes a set of questions to stimulate further discussion

this text is intended for instructors who emphasize teaching students how to locate read and interpret and apply the findings of educational research studies this revision addresses how to design and conduct a research study in more detail the text includes numerous recent published research articles involving high interest problems of educational practice the chapters which treat quantitative qualitative and applied forms of educational research stand alone allowing instructors to choose those they want to cover this text brings research alive for educators by introducing readers to people who actually do research designed for courses focused primarily on applying rather than conducting research it includes 13 actual research articles reprinted in their entirety the book makes no assumptions about readers prior knowledge of research or statistics this text builds students confidence so that they are able to successfully read research reports and research for the first time readers will see the relevance of research to educational practice

this book explores educational research in terms of the relationship between epistemology methodology and practice divided into two sections the first examines the frameworks which underpin the methods educational researchers use the second

looks at a broad spectrum of approaches including feminist approaches action research ethnography and biographical research the issues covered are central to all within the research community including students undertaking research degrees or research methodology courses

written in the language of education not of research this introduction to educational research methods focuses on research as a system of examining and analyzing educational outcomes and the many ways in which teachers administrators and guidance counselors can apply research findings to solving the day to day problems they face it provides numerous examples taken from classroom teaching counseling administration and other areas of education covers all of the traditional topics of educational research with a distinctive emphasis on the need for working educators to continue in the role of researchers while they teach provides thorough treatment of measurement essentials for those with little or no statistical background features a wealth of classroom examples along with dozens of charts tables and graphs the second edition features new chapters on qualitative methods and meta analysis and interjects an overall qualitative flavor throughout

emphasizing the comparative aspects of research this introduction to educational research traces the process through five stages choosing what to study including specifying the research problem collecting information organizing and summarizing information interpreting results and reporting the outcomes each of the stages offers diverse options available to researchers for solving the problems of that stage and a research project checklist at the end of each chapter guides readers in applying the chapter s contents to their own research studies in much educational discourse comparative education has referred solely to the study of educational similarities and differences between regions of the world or between two or more nations this book uses the broader definition of the term to encompass a large body of research including studies focusing on comparisons between local educational systems schools classrooms language groups religious denominations genders social classes and individual students students who are planning research projects as well as staff members of such organizations as ministries of education school systems bureaus of educational research and educational aid agencies will find this volume indispensable
