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sandra beckett's book explores the contemporary retelling of the red riding hood tale in western children's literature

transcending boundaries writing for a dual audience of children and adults is a collection of essays on twentieth century authors who cross the borders between adult and children's literature and appeal to both audiences this collection of fourteen essays by scholars from eight countries constitutes the first book devoted to the art of crosswriting the child and adult in twentieth century international literature sandra beckett explores the multifaceted nature of crossover literature and the diverse ways in which writers cross the borders to address a dual readership of children and adults it considers classics such as alice's adventures in wonderland and pinocchio with particular emphasis on post world war ii literature the essays in transcending boundaries clearly suggest that crossover literature is a major widespread trend that appears to be sharply on the rise

what should children and students read this volume explores challenging picturebooks as learning materials in early childhood education primary and secondary school and even universities it addresses a wide range of

thematic cognitive and aesthetic challenges and educational affordances of picturebooks in various languages and from different countries written by leading and emerging scholars in the field of picturebook studies and literacy research the book discusses the impact of challenging picturebooks in a comprehensive manner and combines theoretical considerations picturebook analyses and empirical studies with children and students it introduces stimulating picturebooks from all continents and how they are used or may be used in educational settings and contexts the chapters touch on subjects like reading promotion second language acquisition art education interdisciplinary learning empathy development minority issues and intercultural competence moreover they consider relevant aspects of the educational environments such as the inclusion of picturebooks in the curriculum the significance of school libraries and the impact of publishers exploring challenging picturebooks in education sheds new light on the multiple dimensions relevant to investigating the impact of picturebooks on learning processes and the development of multimodal literacy competencies it thus makes a significant contribution to the growing area of picturebook research and will be key reading for educators researchers and post graduate students in the field of literacy studies children s literature and education research

contributions by g    e elif baykal lincoln geraghty ver  nica gottau vanessa joosen sung ae lee cecilia lindgren mayako murai emily murphy mariano narodowski johanna sj  berg anna sparrman ingrid tomkowiak helma van lierop debrauwer ilgim veryeri alaca and elisabeth wesseling media narratives in popular culture often assign interchangeable characteristics to childhood and old age presuming a resemblance between children and the elderly these designations in media can have far reaching repercussions in shaping not only language but also cognitive activity and behavior the meaning attached to biological numerical age even the mere fact that we calculate a numerical age at all is culturally determined as is the way people act their age with populations aging all around the world awareness of intergenerational relationships and associations surrounding old age is becoming urgent connecting childhood and old age in popular media caters to this urgency and contributes to age literacy by supplying insights into the connection between childhood and senescence to show that people are aged by culture treating classic stories like the brothers grimm s fairy tales and heidi pop culture hits like the simpsons and mad men and international productions such as turkish television cartoons and south korean films contributors explore the recurrent idea that children are like old people as well as other relationships between children and elderly characters as constructed in literature and media from the mid nineteenth century to the present this volume deals with fiction and analyzes language as well as verbally sparse visual productions including children s literature film television animation and advertising

the work of italian printmaker giovanni battista piranesi 1720 1778 has captivated artists architects and designers for centuries although contemporary australia is a long way from eighteenth century rome it is home to substantial collections of his works the largest being at the state library of victoria and the university of melbourne the piranesi effect is a collection of exquisitely illustrated essays on the impact of piranesi s work throughout the years the book brings together australian and international experts who investigate piranesi s world and its connections to the study of art and the practice of artists today from curators and art historians to contemporary artists like bill henson and ron mcburnie the contributors each bring their own passion and insight into the work of piranesi illuminating what it is about his work that still inspires such wonder

conversations with gish jen is the first collection of interviews with the renowned contemporary american author gish jen b 1955 whose acclaimed fiction and nonfiction have fascinated american readers for more than thirty years the conversations in this book offer first hand information not only about jen s authorial intentions but also about her life as a daughter of chinese immigrants spanning more than two decades beginning in 1991 and ending with a new unpublished interview from 2017 these interviews provide readers a sense of jen s development as a novelist and cultural critic jen s insights into the merits and drawbacks of eastern and western cultures including american individualism and exceptionalism and asian interdependent mindset and living principles provide us with keys to understanding the identity struggles of the author herself as well as her fictional characters the comparative approach jen adopts in her comments on such topics as education politics business religion and concepts of creativity and success provokes readers to reflect on their relationships with themselves with the society in which they live and with the rest of the world at the heart of these conversations is jen s sense of humor which makes the book a joyful read for both scholars and casual fans of her work

this ebook has a fixed layout and is best viewed on a widescreen full colour tablet earth and fire represent the two elements that produce a ceramic object without the other they are simply components together they create both practical objects and pieces of art working as both primer and inspiration earth and fire explores the techniques practices and tools of over forty five working ceramicists creating everything from woodfired and fine porcelain wares sculptured vases everyday cups bowls and plates to jewellery and wall pieces these artists work in a wide range of styles and mediums to create their ceramics although the methods vary the overall sentiment is that the earth and fire that the artists use to make their objects are the ultimate masters just when they think they know one thing the clay glaze and heat will teach them another there will always be more to learn working with clay is quite simply humbling written and compiled by kylie johnson and tiffany johnson earth fire captures the diverse beauty and utility of ceramics demonstrating that clay doesn t just get under your fingernails it gets under your skin

all too often attention is paid only to those children s novels that were written in english with non english language works being passed over and neglected beyond babar the european tradition in children s literature examines eleven of the most celebrated european children s novels in substantial critical essays written by well known international scholars this approach provides a comprehensive discussion of the selected works from a variety of theoretical perspectives each essay offers a critical introduction to the text that can serve as a point of departure for literary scholars professors of children s literature primary and secondary school teachers and librarians who are interested in texts that cross languages and cultures beyond babar is especially meant to assist instructors of children s literature who would like to use these texts in the classroom in order to begin to

redress the english language dominance of many children s literature courses this volume will also be of interest to the general public as its ultimate aim is to bring to the attention of all english speaking readers the literature from other parts of the world in this case from europe beyond babar helps to facilitate the border crossings of these european masterpieces of children s literature into the english speaking world
