feelings during the proof writing process can influence their behavior the concluding chapter of the book reflects on new directions for research on proving as such this book provides mathematics educators who have extensive experience researching proof with an up to date review of the new methodologies and research questions with regard to proof and young scholars interested in proof can use these chapters as primers on which they can build a research program
