inhaltsangabe introduction the show will be a magnificent opulent tremendous stupendous gargantuan bedazzlement a sensual ravishment it will be spectacular spectacular zidler is right that is what moulin rouge is spectacular zidler the impresario of the moulin rouge tries to sell the bohemian play spectacular spectacular which toulouse and christian present to the duke however moulin rouge is spectacular spectacular and vice versa the duke is the maharajah christian is the penniless sitar player and satine is the beautiful courtesan luhrmann s latest work is loud colorful fast postmodern a melodrama and a musical and it is about love opinions are much divided over this film and many critics wonder if it is just bad taste and kitsch or an ingenious piece of film art in other words it is an original baz luhrmann until today the australian director produced three movies which he calls the red curtain trilogy he started with strictly ballroom in 1992 followed by william shakespeare s romeo and juliet in 1996 and ended with moulin rouge in 2001 luhrmann calls his way of filmmaking a theatricalized cinema style baz luhrmann definitely is a unique and versatile character however if his film is art or trash remains a matter of opinion luhrmann himself disassociates from any categorization in the sense of low culture and high art taking into account that back in time shakespeare was also considered as popular culture in the same way as operas were the lowest form of culture at their peak times he counters his critics and their objections die story ist dünn und simpel with doch gerade das ist eine konvention des musicals aber auch der oper mit ausnahme von wagner aber eigentlich zieht auch wagner nur einen dünnen plot in die länge the other often expressed criticism that his latest work is a direct assault on eyes ears and expectations abele and hard to exceed in terms of kitsch he only defies with the credo that persönlicher geschmack ist der feind der kunst moulin rouge is a mélange of film music and

essay from the year 2003 in the subject american studies literature grade 1 0 university of kent school of english course american modernisms language english abstract in an attempt to place ralph waldo ellison s novel invisible man within a modernist framework berndt ostendorf writes ellison is a spätling a latecomer to modernism ellison s modernism is not one of crisis and despair but of innovation and hope he accepts the discipline implied in ezra pound s slogan make it new but rejects the cultural pessimism of his ancestors 1 although ostendorf s description is right insofar that ellison s work is optimistic in its outcome rather than as pessimistic as the majority of modernist novels it does not seem to be in agreement with the term modernism in general isn t modernist literature usually called a literature of crisis 2 isn t modernism said to feature elements of cultural apocalypse rather than the hope ostendorf mentions 3 and doesn t ostendorf s statement resemble a definition of postmodernism rather than modernism in fact ellison s novel is hard to categorize critics agree that invisible man includes

seminar paper from the year 2006 in the subject american studies literature grade 1 0 university of siegen fb 3 literatur sprach und medienwissenschaften course postmodern fiction 26 entries in the bibliography language english abstract with the attention grabbing novel american psycho bret easton ellis entered quite a dangerous ground the bizarre mixture of yuppie satire and splatter horror caused reactions of scathing criticism indignation yes even murder threat as a consequence the publishing house that had the first contract with ellis and was supposed to edit the novel namely simon schuster responded to this radical refusal and cancelled the deal already made this decision not to publish a book due to the negative responds against it meant another scandal since it was a sensation in the american publishing business anyway brushing aside all moral standards ellis shocker was published in 1991 by vintage books and for a while the young writer became the meistgehaßte autor der welt evidently because critics considered his narration too pornographic sexist anti women disgusting boring and beyond belief yet american psycho was regarded with interest probably last but not least because bret easton ellis had been celebrated as a great talent when publishing less than zero meanwhile countless studies with many diverging approaches manifest that american psycho may not be condemned and dismissed as a pure splatter work glorifying violence there are works analysing the

publication and the reception of the novel as well as the socio cultural background other studies focus on content and stylistic device or on the motif of the serial killer as postmodern anti hero additionally some special analyses examine the position of the novel within the american history of censorship or even attempt to draw a parallel from ellis bateman to goethe s faust thus it is substantiated that the interest in american

is charismatic renewal a bit too much like postmodernism with its multiple ways of knowing what is true touchy feely and pragmatic with an emphasis on personal story and community why does it look like something dreamt up by postmoderns longing for a church befitting their ideals this book explores these questions by investigating an example of charismatic renewal the charismatic movement in the church of england leading to some surprising results appearances can be deceiving and what seems postmodern about charismatic renewal is a complex mix of modernism reactions to modernism and a longing to go back to a time before modernism reared its head jitesh patel helps show how renewal s ongoing life has much still to contribute to the wider church s life once it recognizes the strengths and weaknesses of how it has formed in the context of modernism and the chapters herein illuminate what its future could look like as a result

seminar paper from the year 2015 in the subject literature canada grade 2 0 language english abstract the aim of this term paper is to exemplify the central key features in postmodernism and to analyse in how far margaret atwood manages to make use of them in her novel alias grace besides i will concentrate on atwood s strategies to integrate the postmodern features into the novel and to illustrate them to the reader the first part of the term paper will be concerned with a general overview of genette s categories of discourse oriented narratology and the postmodern features fragmentation subjectivity indeterminacy and alienation more precisely i will define these features and will concentrate on the most important characteristics which can be linked to the novel i will mention genette s narrative theory because it is especially important when dealing with fragmentation the second part will be concerned with these postmodern features with reference to alias grace concerning fragmentation i am going to illustrate the

interchanging narratives in the novel when dealing with subjectivity i will analyse in how far different narratives of the story are subjective by pointing out several passages in which open questions remain and the reader has to interpret on his own i will discuss indeterminacy after doing so i am going to point out in how far fragmentation subjectivity and indeterminacy lead to an alienation of the reader at the end of the term paper a conclusion will be drawn in which one can see in how far atwood uses postmodern elements in her novel

seminar paper from the year 2006 in the subject american studies literature grade 1 3 university of potsdam course hs from poe to akunin highlights of the international mystery story in literature and film language english abstract this paper is building up on postmodern patterns of fragmentation loneliness and disorientation the quest is a central storytelling technique in times where traditional ways of living and social constellations fade and the grand narratives have lost their guiding functions people have to mind map their own routes through a fragmentary world the paper establishes the quest form in the 1966 book by pynchon and draws lines of tradition to jarmusch s 2005 browken flowers

the authors systematically interrogate postmodern theory to evaluate its relevance for critical social theory and radical politics today the book contains an introduction and critique to the work of foucault delueze and guattari and an introduction to postmodern feminist theory

examines the characteristics of postmodern organizational forms and dynamics and compares them to those of organizational they functioned in the premodern and modern worlds and continue to function in the hybrid reality of our emerging postmodern world

in heterology and the postmodern julian pefanis presents a new view of the history of poststructuralism heterology and the origins of postmodernism by analyzing three important french theorists georges bataille jean baudrillard and jean françois lyotard beginning with the introduction of hegel in french postmodernist thought largely but not exclusively

through the thought of georges bataille pefanis argues that the core problematics of postmodern aesthetics history exchange representation and writing are related to bataille s reconceptualization of the hegelian framework pefanis explores how bataille was influenced by hegel marcel mauss freud and nietzsche and traces the effects of this influence on the analyses and critiques of later postmodernists most notably lyotard and baudrillard finally employing these postmodernists along with freud and jacques lacan pefanis discusses discourse on postmodernism and its relation to freud s concept of the death drive this intellectual history makes valuable contributions to the debates over what the postmodern may mean for intellectual and political activity

in 1996 physicist alan sokal placed a hoax article in social text mimicking the social constructionist view of science popular in the humanities and sparking the science wars which had rumbled throughout the 90s this book puts the controversy into the context of earlier debates about the two cultures between f r leavis and c p snow and mathew arnold and t h huxley
