the spectres of marx and lenin have long loomed prominently in africa and asia and they still do so in the 21st century many of the founding fathers of postcolonial republics believed socialism could transform their societies yet what socialism meant in theory and in practice has always been highly heterogeneous and differed markedly from the european experience african and asian movements did not simply mimic the ideas and institutions of soviet or european marxists but endeavoured to define their own
