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many sides is the first full length study of protagorean antilogic an argumentative practice with deep roots in rhetorical history and renewed relevance for contemporary culture founded on the philosophical relativism of protagoras antilogic is a dynamic rather than a formal approach to argument focused principally on the dialogical interaction of opposing positions anti-logoi in controversy in ancient athens antilogic was the cardinal feature of sophistic rhetoric in rome cicero redefined sophistic argument in a concrete set of dialogical procedures in turn quintilian inherited this dialogical tradition and made it the centrepiece of his own rhetorical practice and pedagogy many sides explores the history theory and pedagogy of this neglected rhetorical tradition and by appeal to recent rhetorical and philosophical theory reconceives the enduring features of antilogical practice in a dialogical approach to argumentation especially suited to the pluralism of our own age and the diversity of modern classrooms

the authors argue that the aim of research should be to improve practice through a process of critical reflection focusing clearly on the everyday concerns and problems of practitioners they emphasize the importance of practical knowledge their definition of practice is wide and includes the generation of theory and the doing of research as well as front line teaching they show how notions of adult learning and the adult learner have been constituted mainly through theory and research in psychology and sociology and examine action research as a mode of understanding they conclude by looking at the curriculum implications for the teaching of adult education as reflective practice

over the past two decades there has been a plethora of book for students about how to tackle qualitative research qr but absolutely nothing on how to teach it this book attempts to redress the imbalance by presenting a history of what is known about qr teaching as well as to bring alive current qr teaching and learning through a set of australian and british case studies courses visited were located within a variety of disciplines including education sociology anthropology nursing psychology communications and evaluation were taught by both experienced and inexperienced lecturers were either presented alone or in pairs took place in a range of institutions lasted from seven weeks to a year and involved from 15 to over 100 students it emerged however that no matter what the context several common issues were raised such as should you teach theory practice or both how do you

determine a curriculum for a qr course what is the best way to manage student projects how should students of qr be assessed in what ways can the constraints of university structures be confronted and how can lecturer deficiencies in training and experience be overcome to answer such questions professor hurworth draws deftly from personal observations and rich conversations with both lecturers and students from all the courses described as a result many practical ideas for moving the teaching and learning of qr forward are suggested
