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the recent explosion of unsolicited material written for the world's greatest sexiest entertainment medium has largely produced a mountain of wasted paper truth is the many who write from scratch no matter how talented have more chance of winning the lottery than creating an excellent script the few who achieve success do so because they have shed the blood sweat and tears necessary to master the elaborate art and craft of screenwriting this book explodes the myth that a screenplay is the easiest literary form to master navigates a relatively painless path through the screenwriting labyrinth and offers an easy to digest step by step guide to writing a script from inception to completion what's in it the main areas covered are motivation research development genre idea story plot audience character action setting structure format dialogue synopses treatments drafts marketing the industry there's also a glossary of commonly used jargon to further demystify the process

writing your first play provides the beginning playwright with the tools and motivation to tell a story through dramatic form based in a series of exercises which gradually grow more complex the book helps the reader to understand the basic elements of drama conflict and action the exercises help the reader to become increasingly sophisticated in the use of dramatic formats turning simple ideas into a viable play topics include the role of action in drama developing action and conflict to reveal character writing powerful and persuasive dialog writing from personal experience pros and cons how to begin the story and develop the storyline this new edition is thoroughly updated and contains new examples based on contemporary plays the author has added additional writing exercises and a new student written one act play it also contains a new chapter on how to sell your play once it is written with examples based on student work this text both inspires and educates the student and fledgling playwright providing solid tools and techniques for the craft of writing a drama roger a hall a professor of theatre at james madison university had taught playwriting for

nearly 20 years many of his students have gone on to write for theatre television and the screen he has written numerous plays and articles and has acted and directed extensively in the theatre

this work is the first of its kind to single out individual short fiction films for comprehensive presentation and close study two men and a wardrobe roman polanski poland 1958 15 min coffee and cigarettes jim jarmusch usa 1986 6 min sunday john lawlor ireland 1988 8 min cat s cradle liz hughes australia 1991 12 min eating out pal sletaune norway 1993 7 min come marianne olsen ulrichsen norway 1995 4 5 min wind marcell ivanyi hungary 1996 6 min possum brad mcgann new zealand 1997 14 min and the war is over nina mimica italy 1997 7 min are the nine short fiction films studied the films represent a broad range of storytelling approaches and a number of very different film cultures each film has a chapter of its own including a shot by shot reproduction of the film with a still from every shot in most cases an interview with the director and an original screenplay and storyboard is also included the book also describes a new conceptual model derived from the films studied in the work which can be used both for analyzing the ways in which a short fiction film tells its story and as a set of guidelines for student filmmakers writing their own screenplays instructors considering this book for use in a course may request an examination copy here
