hurray for michael palmer is how michael martin the distinguished american philosopher greeted palmer s the atheist s primer lutterworth 2012 atheism for beginners by providing a coursebook for schools and colleges differs from its predecessor in being designed specifically for teachers and their students yet although different in focus and format the intention remains the same to reinstate the importance of philosophy within the debate about god s existence and to act as a corrective tothe largely darwinian criticisms levelled against religious belief by richard dawkins and the so called new
