scene it should also be mentioned that a long ages world view introduces more scientific difficulties than it seeks to solve e g features of the universe which could not be as we now see them if there had been the long ages which are mooted this is not the place to expand on this but there is much literature available on the subject both scriptural and scientific ed stem
