excerpt from an introduction to special school work vol 7 the systematic education of mentally defective children has passed through various phases since its early days while changes in both procedure and method have been frequent some theories have been discarded others modified or strengthened and new ones have been put forward most of this development has been brought about by the wonderful enthusiasm for something and faith in something of earnest workers carried out with enterprise and devotion until the merits of the movement have been recognized these ideas have been communicated almost entirely by means of conferences and verbal intercourse there are however many young teachers opening new schools and taking charge of classes who will need several years experience before they can hope to know the defective child sufficiently well to have any strong convictions with regard to his training there are at the present time many who have
