the conventional wisdom in english education is that rubrics are the best and easiest tools for assessment but sometimes it s better to be unconventional in rethinking rubrics in writing assessment maja wilson offers a new perspective on rubrics and argues for a better more responsive way to think about assessing writers progress though you may sense a disconnect between student centered teaching and rubric based assessment you may still use rubrics for convenience or for want of better alternatives rethinking rubrics in writing assessment gives you the impetus to make a change demonstrating how rubrics can hurt kids and replace professional decision making with an inauthentic pigeonholing that stamps standardization

onto a notably nonstandard process with an emphasis on thoughtful planning and teaching wilson shows you how to reconsider writing assessment so that it aligns more closely with high quality instruction and avoids the potentially damaging effects of rubrics stop listening to the conventional wisdom and turn instead to a compelling new voice to find out why rubrics are often replaceable open rethinking rubrics in writing assessment and let maja wilson start you down the path to more sensitive authentic style of writing assessment
