stella's black paintings of 1959 meyer outlines the shifting often warring definitions of this new kind of art once sculptors andre and judd had made their mark there was doubt that painters could be minimalists brice marden and robert ryan made the cut because their work was believed to be purely about the process of painting interestingly although this was overwhelmingly a male club curators also initially embraced the work of several women artists including agnes martin and anne trutt who retained such minimalist no-noes as irregular handmade marks color that could be perceived independently of form and a belief in transcendent meaning

american art of the 1980s is as misunderstood as it is notorious critics of the time feared that market hype and self-promotion threatened the integrity of art they lashed out at contemporary art questioning the validity of particular media and methods and dividing the art into opposing camps while controversies have since subsided critics still view art of the 1980s as a stylistic battlefield alison pearlman rejects this picture which is truer of the period's criticism than of its art pearlman reassesses the works and careers of six artists who became critics' biggest targets in each of three chapters

she pairs two artists the critics viewed as emblematic of a given trend julian schnabel and david salle in association with neo expressionism jean michel basquiat and keith haring vis à vis graffiti art and peter halley and jeff koons in relation to simulationism pearlman shows how all these artists shared important but unrecognized influences and approaches a crucial and overwhelming inheritance of 1960s and 1970s conceptualism a warholian understanding of public identity and a deliberate and nuanced use of past styles and media through in depth discussions of works from haring s body paintings of grace jones to schnabel s movie basquiat pearlman demonstrates how these artists interests exemplified a broader generational shift unrecognized by critics she sees this shift as starting not in the 1980s but in the mid 1970s when key developments in artistic style art world structures and consumer culture converged to radically alter the course of american art unpackaging art of the 1980s offers an innovative approach to one of the most significant yet least understood episodes in twentieth century art

the twelfth century manuscript of gregory the great s moralia in job lavishly written and illuminated at the cistercian monastery of cîteaux in 1111 contains images of seemingly gratuitous violence and daily life that are famous but have a significance that has eluded most modern viewers these images range anywhere from monstrous beasts that devour and hack at each other with swords to monks harvesting grain and felling trees they have been called by some scholars the products of unbridled often irrational fantasy entirely independent of the text and of any specific meaning in this book conrad rudolph argues that beyond the face value of these illuminations there lies an undercurrent of thematic consistency like obscure events from scripture he maintains the images may lead to another level of meaning yet to be discovered rudolph focuses on the ways spirituality and politics operate in the artistic process that produced this particular manuscript by exploring these interactions we can understand how the form of spirituality embodied in this manuscript legitimized a very intimate attitude on the part of the artist toward the subject the images are in fact the product of gregory s demand that one become what one reads some reflect the ideal monk crafting a holy place out of the wilderness others the cistercian notion of spiritual advancement as a violent struggle in this way the cîteaux moralia in job conveys an exuberance and creativity rarely found in manuscript illumination before or since
