productive life how should you make moral decisions what do you believe to be true do you believe in a supreme being how  
do you decide your moral compass this work by the author of *le bovarysme* treats the tendency to think of things other than  
they are as a living source of art jules de gautier sees this sort of behavior not as a moral or ethical problem but an aesthetic  
problem his metaphysical position has a long and complicated history which can be traced back to the philosophical  
musings of kant schopenhauer and nietzsche this book was his first published work and serves as a thought provoking  
introduction to his philosophy

the fate of reason is the first general history devoted to the period between kant and fichte one of the most revolutionary  
and fertile in modern philosophy the philosophers of this time broke with the two central tenets of the modern cartesian  
tradition the authority of reason and the primacy of epistemology they also witnessed the decline of the aufklärung the  
completion of kant s philosophy and the beginnings of post kantian idealism thanks to beiser we can newly appreciate the  
influence of kant s critics on the development of his philosophy beiser brings the controversies and the personalities who  
engaged in them to life and tells a story that has uncanny parallels with the debates of the present

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in from kant to husserl charles parsons examines a wide range of historical opinion on philosophical questions from mathematics to phenomenology amplifying his early ideas on kant s philosophy of arithmetic the author then turns to reflections on frege brentano and husserl

critique has been a central theme in the german philosophical tradition since the publication of immanuel kant s critique of pure reason some successors turned kant s critique against itself and used it to challenge the authority of his system others extended his critique applying it to aesthetics epistemology ethics metaphysics and political philosophy and generating new forms of criticism that were then taken up by idealism romanticism marxism neo kantianism phenomenology and critical theory yet these various legacies of kantian critique are rarely brought into dialogue critique in german philosophy seeks to address this problem by exploring the figures works movements and philosophical subfields that have contributed to the development of the concept of critique in german philosophy as well as their relation to one another in so doing it also challenges the standard ways philosophers have understood the task of philosophical critique attending to both canonical and previously overlooked texts and thinkers the contributors bring to light alternative conceptions of critique in the german philosophical tradition with profound implications in offering a critical revision of the history of modern european philosophy the volume also raises new questions about what it means for philosophy to be critical today

in the mid eighteenth century metaphysics was broadly understood as the study of three areas of philosophical thought

theology psychology and cosmology this book examines the fortunes of the third of these formidable metaphysical concepts the world sean gaston provides a clear and concise account of the concept of world from the mid eighteenth century to the end of the twentieth century exploring its possibilities and limitations and engaging with current issues in politics and ecology he focuses on the work of five principal thinkers kant hegel husserl heidegger and derrida all of whom attempt to establish new grounds for seeing the world as a whole gaston presents a critique of the self evident use of the concept of world in philosophy and asks whether one can move beyond the need for a world like vantage point to maintain a concept of world from kant to the present day this concept has been a problem for philosophy and it remains to be seen if we need a new copernican revolution when it comes to the concept of world

the scope and method of logic as we know it today eminently reflect the ground breaking developments of set theory and the logical foundations of mathematics at the turn of the 20th century unfortunately little effort has been made to understand the idiosyncrasies of the philosophical context that led to these tremendous innovations in the 19th century beyond what is found in the works of mathematicians such as frege hilbert and russell this constitutes a monumental gap in our understanding of the central influences that shaped 19th century thought from kant to russell and that helped to create the conditions in which analytic philosophy could emerge the aim of logic from kant to russell is to document the development of logic in the works of 19th century philosophers it contains thirteen original essays written by authors from a broad range of backgrounds intellectual historians historians of idealism philosophers of science and historians of logic and analytic philosophy these essays question the standard narratives of analytic philosophy s past and address concerns that are relevant to the contemporary philosophical study of language mind and cognition the book covers a broad range of influential thinkers in 19th century philosophy and analytic philosophy including kant bolzano hegel herbart lotze the british algebraists and idealists moore russell the neo kantians and frege

j albert coffa traces the roots of logical positivism in a semantic tradition that arose in opposition to kant s theory that a priori knowledge is based on pure intuition

contemporary philosophy and literary theory are based upon german philosophy from kant onwards drawing on recent german theory the author reconsiders the path of german philosophy from kant to nietzsche in relation to consciousness aesthetics and language he provides interpretations of kant fichte the early romantics schelling hegel schleiermacher and nietzsche telling a different story of modernity to the one current in many areas of the humanities the book traces the beginnings of modern debates on aesthetics and politics as well as the origins of modern hermeneutics paying attention to the significance of music in modern philosophy

religion and violence philosophical perspectives from kant to derrida s careful posing of such questions and rearticulations pioneers new modalities for systematic engagement with religion and philosophy alike arthur bradley year s work in critical and cultural theory

being guilty examines the thought of six central german philosophers kant schelling schopenhauer paul rée nietzsche and heidegger on the phenomenon of guilt or the painful sting of bad conscience suffered when we perform a wrong action the work also examines these philosophers views on responsibility freedom and conscience it concludes with the novel argument that the thought of heidegger provides a synthesis of the insights of the previous philosophers and overcomes their deficiencies through heidegger and his predecessors the author articulates a new theoretical approach to guilt

scholarship on kant s practical philosophy has often overlooked its reception in the early days of post kantian philosophy and german idealism this volume of new essays illuminates that reception and how it informed the development of practical philosophy between kant and hegel the essays discuss in addition to kant hegel and fichte relatively little known thinkers such as pistorius ulrich maimon erhard e reimarus reinhold jacobi f schlegel humboldt dalberg gentz rehberg and möser issues discussed include the empty formalism objection the separation between right and morality freedom and determinism nihilism the right to revolution ideology and the limits of the liberal state taken together the essays provide an historically informed and philosophically nuanced picture of the development of post kantian practical philosophy

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
