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published to coincide with an institute of international visual arts exhibition a study of the historical cultural and artistic significance of the veil features commissioned essays and a range of excerpts from classical historical texts

in this accessible combination of post colonial theory feminism and pedagogy the author advocates using subversive and contemporary artistic representations of women to remodel traditional stereotypes in education it is in this key sector that values and norms are molded and prejudice kept at bay yet the legacy of colonialism continues to pervade official education received in classrooms as well as unofficial education ingested via popular culture and the media the result is a variety of distorted images of women and gender in which women appear as two dimensional stereotypes the text analyzes both current and historical colonial representations of women in a pedagogical context in doing so it seeks to recast our conception of what difference is challenging historical patriarchal gender relations with their stereotypical representations that continue to marginalize minority populations in the first world and billions of women elsewhere these distorted images the book argues can be subverted using the semiology provided by postcolonialism and transnational feminism and the work of contemporary artists who rethink and recontextualize the visual codes of colonialism these resistive images created by women who challenge and subvert patriarchal modes of representation can be used to create educational environments that provide an alternative view of women of non western origin

this volume examines the complex histories politics and experiences of wearing islamic dress in sub saharan africa heather marie akou indiana university bloomington the tradition of the veil which refers to various cloth coverings of the head face and body has been little studied in africa where islam has been present for more than a thousand years these lively essays raise questions about what is distinctive about veiling in africa what religious histories or practices are reflected in particular uses of the veil and how styles of veils have changed in response to contemporary events together they explore the diversity of meanings and experiences with the veil revealing it as both an object of muslim piety and an expression of glamorous fashion this is an exciting and strong collection of original research on women s and men s veiling practices in a range of african muslim settings and the social and religious discourses that accompany changes in dress over time taken as a whole it offers a fascinating overview of african muslim interpretations of theological debates about the veil and gender relations in muslim societies while illustrating some of the particular accommodations adopted by african women international journal of african historical studies explores the many meanings and uses of veiling which is so often treated as a monolithic phenomenon emblematic of islam in different african and african diaspora contexts emma tarlo goldsmiths university of london

crossing disciplinary and chronological boundaries this volume integrates text and image essays and object pages to explore the processes inherent in gender representation rather than resituating women in particular categories or spheres as other scholarly publications and exhibitions have done taking its lead from the picturing women project on which it reflects and builds the volume makes a substantial methodological contribution to the analysis of gender discourse and visibility it offers new and stimulating scholarship that confronts historical patterns of representation that have defined what women were and are seen to be and presents new contexts for unveiling what art historian linda nochlin has called the mixed messages of representations of women

as we must know the hijab has been historically considered in euro america a symbol of difference between east and west the hijab was also mostly seen and described as awful regarding gender politics visibility and the conception of self even france still has a law against it surprisingly the muslim woman s veil constitutes a common site in euro american visual culture contemporary veil art has helped inspire some scholarship which has begun to broach the topic of the veil specifically examining its role in colonial modernist feminist and muslim discourses probing its resurgence east and west and analyzing its significance in media representations arguing in support of the veil s multivalence and seeking to rectify the dearth of many studies on the topic this book initiates a mapping of the veil in contemporary art underscoring the alternative narratives to mainstream the representations it proffers and exploring its myriad meanings and its link to the wider issues of gender politics and identity i hope the book will truly inspire our important multiculturalism

anchored in artistic practice this vibrant collection of essays and writings spans a period from 1992 2017 and the work of leading artists such as adel abdessemed richard avedon sonia boyce frank bowling omer fast mona hatoum susan hiller alfredo jaar glenn ligon and shen yuan a key figure in british and international art gilane tawadros draws difference to the surface recuperating it as a potentially radical frame through which to understand contemporary art and the everyday world playing with forms of writing from critical analyses

to fictional narratives the book functions as a practice based meditation on how to write about contemporary art

christianity is a religion of clothing to become a priest or a nun is to take the cloth the christian liturgy is intimately bound with veiling objects and revealing them cloths hide the altar making it all the more spectacular when it is revealed fragments of imported silk cradle the relic thereby giving identity to the dessicated bone much of that silk came from the east meaning that a material of islamic origin was a primary signifier of sanctity in christianity weaving veiling and dressing brings together twelve essays about text and textile about silk and wool about the formation of identity through fibre the essays bring to light hitherto unseen material and for the first time establish the function of textiles as a culturally rich way to approach the middle ages textiles were omnipresent in the medieval church but have not survived well to uncover their uses presence and meanings in the middle ages is to reconsider the period spun draped clothed shrouded and dressed textiles in particular were essential to the performance of devotion and of the liturgy brightly dyed cloth was a highly visible maker of meaning while some aspects of culture have been studied namely the important tapestry industry as well as some of the repercussions and activities of cloth guilds other areas of textile studies in the period are yet to be studied this book brings an interdisciplinary approach to new material drawing on art history anthropology medieval text history theology and gender and performance studies it makes a compelling miscellany exploring the nature of christianity in the largely uninvestigated field of text and textile interplay

feminism is one of the most important perspectives from which visual culture has been theorised and historicised over the past 30 years this book brings together a wide array of writings including classic texts and polemical new pieces
