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but in the musical drama reality begins to blur the musical forms lose their excessively neat patterns and doubt and ambiguity undermine characters and situations reflecting the crisis of character typical of modernity indeed much of the interest and originality of Verdi's operas lie in his adherence to both these contradictory systems allowing the composer dramatist to be simultaneously classical and modern traditionalist and innovator

applied theatre practice it draws on the authors practice and research in prisons with military veterans and families older adults people living with dementia intergenerational community groups and end of life care settings offering guiding principles for practitioners undertaking work in this field and sharing techniques and exercises to help develop your style and approach it also features handy hints and pitfalls to consider while working with someone's most precious commodity their life story featuring both the authors and participants perspectives the book explores concepts such as collaborative editing and co creation ownership and accountability ethics and boundaries and rolling consent alongside a growing interest in using personal stories in applied theatre it argues that there is increasing evidence for the role of the arts in the promotion of health prevention of ill health and management and treatment of illness in light of the steady increase in a diverse range of arts practitioners embracing narrative practice this book is an accessible practitioner level text on the subject

offering a roadmap for practicing verbatim theatre plays created from oral histories this book outlines theatre processes through the lens of oral history and draws upon oral history scholarship to bring best practices from that discipline to theatre practitioners this book opens with an overview of oral history and verbatim theatre considering the ways in which existing oral history debates can inform verbatim theatre processes and highlights necessary ethical considerations within each field which are especially prevalent when working with narrators from marginalised communities it provides a step by step guide to creating plays from interviews and contains practical guidance for determining the scope of a theatre project identifying narrators and conducting interviews developing a script from excerpts of interview transcripts and outlining a variety of ways to create verbatim theatre productions by bringing together this explicit discussion of oral history in relationship to theatre based on personal testimonies the reader gains insight into each field and the close relationship between the two supported by international case studies that cover a wide range of working methods and productions including the laramie project and parramatta girls this is the perfect guide for oral historians producing dramatic representations of the material they have sourced through interviews and for writers creating professional theatre productions community projects or student plays

a comprehensive and authoritative single volume reference work on the theatre arts of asia oceania nine expert scholars provide entries on performance in twenty countries from pakistan in the west through india and southeast asia to china japan and korea in the east an introductory pan asian essay explores basic themes they include ritual dance puppetry training performance and masks the national entries concentrate on the historical development of theatre in each country followed by entries on the major theatre forms and articles on playwrights actors and directors the entries are accompanied by rare photographs and helpful reading lists
